Organisation Against Drugs (OKANA)

the **biggest public service provider** on the field of addictions and behavioral addictions in Greece

4 main pillars: Prevention, Treatment, Harm Reduction-Direct Access and Social Reintegration

- 75 Prevention Centers
- 64 facilities providing OST treatment with the 2 of them to provide OST treatment within Prisons
- 7 Drug-free treatment programs
- 24 Harm Reduction direct access programs
- 7 Social Reintegration programs all over Greece

More than **9000 beneficiaries** in treatment programs / **20.000** in Harm Reduction / **400** in Reintegration

More than **1000 employees (psychiatrists, pathologists, anesthesiologists, nurses, social workers, administrative staff and specialized therapists), covering the full spectrum of the needs of the beneficiaries**





Expanding the purpose and services of OKANA...

Law **4737/2020** expands OKANA's purpose to **include all addictions and addictive behaviors.** The organization takes on the extremely important task of **dealing with legal addictions such as alcohol, gambling and internet/gaming.** Addictions that have increased in Greece in recent years.

16 NSRF programs:

- 6 Day Centers
- 5 Mobile units
- 5 Centers for addictions
- 1 shelter/day center for homeless drug users
- 1 alcohol and legal addiction detox
- 1 social reintegration program
- 2 programs for young people arrested with drugs in order to avoid arrested and enter psychosocial support in an early stage
- 3 programs for parental support
- 3 social reintegration programs with legal support

Expansion of OKANA: 130 services and facilities for 240.000 beneficiaries all over Greece



Prevention:

• 210.000 beneficiaries, 424 people occupied

Harm Reduction:

• More than **20.000** beneficiaries

Treatment:

- 7.600 (monthly average) in OST treatment programs – (73% buprenorphine, 27% methadone)
- From the 7.600 people in OST treatment 4,7% are HIV positive while 60% are HCV positive; 27,3% of the beneficiaries has already been treated the last year
- 580 (monthly average) in drug free treatment programs

Social Reintegration:

• 367 (monthly average) beneficiaries



Harm reduction policy: The key to achieve the holistic and people-centered approach



Before three years there was a gap of:

Covering the needs of more than 2000 active drug users (hidden population)

> Reducing the concentration of the **high-risk population**

Reducing transmitted diseases and preventing diseases' outbreaks among drug users.

Treating of overdoses

Reducing crime that may be associated with drug use at meeting places

Lack of services and facilities such as Naloxone and DCR

Access for immigrants to the services and facilities of OKANA due to the lack of information

Covering basic needs which were even more intensified by covid19 pandemic



Harm Reduction in Athens

In order to meet the needs of more than **2000** drug users and the community,

OKANA the last three years:

- Intensified streetwork actions
- Streetwork actions within immigrants' campus
- Opened the DCR "STEKI 46"
- Opened the new Shelter
- Opened Day centers
- Participated in programs for HIV/HCV
- Made a positive statement for the expansion of the framework of Naloxone use

Essential was the contribution of the Government and the Ministry of Health. There was also support by the Police and Municipality of Athens

- The government instantly recognized the need to establish and operate these facilities
- ✓ The legal framework of Naloxone and DCR's were supported by the government and local authorities
- ✓ Close collaboration of all was the key to succeed.
- Today, harm reduction completed the network. OKANA is now providing an integrated and holistic network of services in prevention, harm reduction, treatment and social reintegration, ensuring access for all!!!


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Distributions of Syringes per Year:



The first DCR in Athens...

12 spaces for safe injecting and/or inhaling use

- ✓ a waiting room for the beneficiaries of DCR services,
- ✓ a fully equipped infirmary for primary health care and overdose treatment,
- ✓ and a room for counseling and psychological support.

Data (from 18/4/2022-31/1/2023):

- > 19.630 total visits
- 760 individual registered persons
- **7.421** cases of supervised use within DCR
- 9.975 other services were provided to beneficiaries within DCR (primary health care, hygiene, medical monitoring, psychosocial support)
- Prevention of overdose in 56 individuals, with close supervision (monitoring)

43 cases of overdose were treated with naloxone use



OKANA officially operates the **first Drug Consumption Room** (DCR) "STEKI 46" in Athens on 18/4/2022





The new Shelter/Day center of OKANA



Already **2026** people are benefited by the Shelter/Day center services during its operation till now:

- 1) 764 connections with treatment programs were implemented
- 2) 226 people spent the night in the Shelter
- 3) Food was provided to **2158** people
- 4) Personal hygiene care services were provided to **932** people
- 5) 771 people received counseling and psychological support
- 6) **1160** people received primary health care

TITYOS Program

Program to eradicate Hepatitis among beneficiaries of the organization's OST programs

The 1st Greek Hepatitis Elimination Program

All beneficiaries of the organization's OST programs who have HCV will be monitored

Access to treatment within 1 year.

The program will prevent 180 cirrhosis, 82 cases of hepatocellular carcinoma and 26 deaths by 2028.

Savings of 8 million in the health system by 2028.

HIPPOCRATES Program

- A program to create a complete automated system for timely and reliable detection of epidemic outbreaks.
- The program includes the development of an algorithm for assessing individual risk of infection with a focus on HIV and Hepatitis B, C.
- It will be applied to OKANA beneficiaries who inject opioids.
- ✓ To date, 1902 people have been examined in 20 OKANA Structures

INOVATIVE PROGRAMS

ESCAPE Project: Syringe residues analysis

Participation of OKANA for the first time in the project ESCAPE for the analysis of 300 syringes from different locations of the cities of Athens and Thessaloniki (150 each), in order to study the substances contained in the syringes, to identify new trends in drug substances and to determine the extent of use of the already known substances in these cities

The 1st time that Greece participates in this global project

OKANA participates with two cities, Athens and Thessaloniki, collecting 300 syringes (150 in each city)



European Monitoring Centre for Drugs and Drug Addiction

the syringes collected by OKANA streetworkers were analyzed by the Laboratory of Forensic Medicine and Toxicology of Aristotle Medical School in Thessaloniki






Pilot program intervention within detention centers for immigrants – Outreach actions

Next steps..

- ✓ There are already 3 mobile units in the cities of Patra, Rethymno and Tripoli providing harm reduction services
- OKANA, in collaboration with the Municipality of Athens, plans to establish 5 mobile DCRs that will operate 24/7.
- >In addition, OKANA plans to establish one **mobile DCR in Thessaloniki**.
- >More intervention within detention centers plus providing OST treatment
- **>Low threshold units** providing treatment with methadone
- Syringe collection programs
- **Expansion of DCR working hours** (8.00-22.00) every day
- Reinforcement of social reintegration provide legal support
